To say it's been a challenging year is somewhat of an understatement. As with all charities Covid and financial pressures together with world issues have caused many problems. It's been hard work recovering the ITPAS reputation, but we are slowly achieving this.

Our main objectives have been to return ITPAS to the forefront of the community's awareness by; increasing members contact with updates and newsletters, increased events and activities such as the village tidying sessions and ITPAS talks, increased liaison with the council re the local plan and local issues and protecting our green belt. Our planning officer continues to scrutinise all building applications, the Local Plan and any green belt activity. The new website has proven very successful together with our continued update on the Irby Facebook page. We have also improved our IT systems, processes and procedures to become more efficient and effective.

One of the most important activities has been the establishment of the WGSA (Wirral Green Space Alliance) formed to fight the developers and Leverhulme Estates attempts to derail the Local Plan and build on our precious green belt. We have won some battles, but more hearings and appeals are planned. The war is not over !!!

The charity trustees and the committee members have also seen changes with new and established ITPAS officers re-establishing their activities. More detail is below.
